MEDIA ADVISORY: TOMORROW IN DAUPHIN COUNTY — Shapiro Administration and Keystone Contractors Association to Encourage all Pennsylvanians to Drop off Unwanted Meds on National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day, Pick up Narcan

Harrisburg, PA - Tomorrow, the **Shapiro Administration** will encourage all Pennsylvanians to take part in National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day on Saturday, October 25, and remind them to get rid of unused and unwanted medications and also pick up a supply of Narcan to have on hand in the event of an overdose.

The Administration is hosting the event with the Keystone Contractors Association to further highlight the prevalence of substance use disorder (SUD) in the construction industry, and to discuss their collaborative efforts to provide education and prevention for employees in this field, and to remind them of available SUD resources.
